Hedgehog class

Our key question is:

Why is farming so important?

In Geography, we will learn why farming is important by exploring how land is used to grow food.

In Science, we will learn to identify common plants, understand what plants need to grow, and explore living things, habitats and how plants change as they grow.

In Badger class our focus text will be Jim and the Beanstalk

In Hedgehog class our focus text will be You must wear a hat.

Fox class

Our key question is:

How is land used for farming in the UK and why to farmers choose to use land in different ways?

In Geography, we will learn how land across the UK is used for different types of farming and why farmers choose particular methods based on the landscape, resources and needs of the environment.

In Science, we will learn about the nutrition animals (including humans) need to stay healthy, how changing environments can pose risks to living things, and how to build and interpret food chains by identifying producers, predators and prey.

Our focus text will be Charlotte's Web

Religious Education- Christianity- Gospel

The Gospel teaches about the life and message of Jesus, helping pupils understand key Gospel stories and what they mean for Christians today.

Learners explore how Jesus' teachings on love, forgiveness and peace guide Christian living, and reflect on how this 'good news' can also relate to

Otter Class

Our key question is:

How does farming in the UK connect us to global trade, and how do different ways of using land affect people and the environment?

In Geography, Otter Class will learn how farming in the UK links to global trade, exploring how the ways land is used can benefit or impact people, communities and the environment.

In Science, Otter Class will learn about life cycles and reproduction in plants and animals, how living things are classified based on observable characteristics, and how plants adapt to their environments—with some adaptations leading to evolution

We will be using a range of texts to ensure we produce a range of writing styles.

Physical Development

Personal development
